Benefits of Scribing

- You will learn what the judges are looking for at each level, what they reward, and what they want the competitors to improve.
- Understanding a judges perspective will help you ride a better test.
- Understanding the scoring system will help you to decipher your score sheets.



The Judge and their Scribe

- Judges depend upon the scribe to act quickly, accurately, legibly, and quietly record the scores and comments made about each ride.
- It is not appropriate for the scribe to comment on the decisions of the judge.
- Never volunteer information about the competitor or their horse.
- Never ask questions about your own riding or a particular horse problem.



The Day of the Show

- The scribe should arrive at least one-half hour early and check in with show management.
- Dress comfortably but appropriately. Remember that you will be center stage with the judge.
- Once at the judge's box, the scribe should organize the work area and check for all proper materials (show schedule sorted by ride times, labeled score sheets collated by ride times, black and red pens, whistle or bell, a blank score sheet for each test for the judge.
- As each horse warms up by working around the arena before the ride begins, the scribe must check the horse's number to ensure it is the same number marked on the test sheet and class list or program.



The Scoring Process

- The scribe must quickly and legibly record all scores and comments given by the judge.
- The scribe should clarify whether the judge will give the score or comment first for each maneuver.
- The scores will range from 0-10 and are made in half points for all tests except musical freestyle test which are scored in .1 increments. All scores must have a decimal written, ie .0, .5, .3 etc.

Errors

- An error of test occurs when a rider goes off course or does not perform the movement as prescribed.
- In the movement where the error occurred, the word error is put in the "directive ideas" column. The scribe should circle the word error. The total deduction for errors will be entered by the Judge at the bottom of the page.
- Use of voice is not an error of test but may be penalized by the Judge. "Use of voice" should be written in the remarks column for the movement in which the penalty occurs.

Finishing the Test

- After the ride is complete, make sure there is a score in every box.
- Make sure each test is signed by the judge before it is sent to the scorers.
- Any change of score on the test must be initialed by the judge.
- Remind the judge of any errors and confirm that the errors total has been documented.
- Check off each horse on the program as it completes their test.



Requirements for Different Classes

- Musical Freestyle
- Equitation





Freestyle Directions

- The freestyle movements are not done in a particular order, the scoresheets are organized by gait with a bold line separating the gaits (walk, trot, and canter).
- Left and right for each movement are also in bold. This will help you find the correct box quickly when the judge gives a score. Make the marks for the scores small since there may be multiple scores per movement box.

Freestyle Directions

- Ask the judge how they prefer to handle the artistic impression. They may want to complete this section themselves.
- Make sure there's a final score in every box as well as the collective and artistic scores.
- Musical freestyle tests are scored using .1 increments.



Equitation Directions

- Equitation classes are performed in a group not to exceed 25 riders.
- You will be asked to stand with your judge. Ask the judge how they would like you to record their comments.
- Place rider numbers on the scoresheet. It may also be helpful to add an identifying feature.
- You may be asked to call out the judge's instructions for the class.

Verbal comments are encouraged. ***ONLY the "TOTAL SCORE" and "PLACE" columns are REQUIRED to be marked for EACH rider. ***



Helpful Tips

- Familiarize yourself with the approved scribe abbreviations.
- Write comments clearly and legibly on test - riders can't improve if they can't read the test!
- Any and all comments made by the judge are confidential.





Helpful Tips

- Limit conversations with other people in the booth or runners as to not distract the judge from their job.
- A scribe may occasionally confirm the movement number with the judge. In the event the judge omits a score or you miss a score, skip the score and ask the judge for the correction at the end of the test.
