ENTRIES: Only online entries will be accepted; http://dancinghorsedressage.org/shows-and-clinics/. No mail in entries will be accepted. Submitted entries must be **complete** and submitted on or between the opening and closing dates of the show being entered to be accepted.

A <u>complete</u> entry includes <u>ALL</u> of the following:

- Fully executed entry from
- Online payment for entry total
- Signed waiver (for both rider and owner if owner is not the rider)
- Copy of current negative Coggins (BLOOD DRAWN ON DATE within past 12 months of show date)

ONLY COMPLETE ENTRIES WILL BE CONSIDERED FOR SCHEDULING and entries will be prioritized based on the timestamp of electronically submitted entries. Complete entries which cannot be scheduled due to the capacity limits of the show, will be prioritized based on time and date the entry was submitted and placed on a waiting list.

ENTRY/STABLING FEES:

Office Fee - \$25 per horse and rider combination

Class Fee - \$30 per class for DHD & CT Members and \$40 per class for non DHD & CT Members; either the rider or the horse owner must be a DHD & CT member to qualify for the member class fee; no class fee for Dressage Seat Equitation (select check box on entry form)

Non-competing horse - \$10 schooling fee plus office fee and stall fee (if applicable); must complete an entry (including Coggins and Waiver)

Horse and Tack stalls - \$35 per stall for the day of the show. No stall bedding is provided and footing is sand. Stall fees include cleaning by DHD. In the event of a full barn, stalls will be prioritized in the order of competing horses, non-showing horses, and tack stalls. Refunds will be provided for stalls when not available or not used.

REFUNDS: For scratches on or before the closing date, all entry and stall fees will be fully refunded. For scratches after the closing date, class and office fees are nonrefundable, but stall fees are refunded. Refund Exception: If a valid, complete entry cannot be scheduled due to the capacity limits of the show, the entry is 100% refundable.

RIDE TIMES: Ride Times will be posted on the Dancing Horse Dressage Website, https://dancinghorsedressage.org/shows-and-clinics/, after noon on the Wednesday prior to the show.

CANCELLATIONS: In case of impending severe weather, a committee consisting of the President and Show Manager may cancel a show. Any cancellation due to weather will be posted on https://dancinghorsedressage.org/shows-and-clinics/ no later than noon the day preceding the show. The show

may be rescheduled at a later date, not necessarily at the same venue. Competitors will be refunded all fees in the event of cancellation for inclement weather.

WEATHER DELAYS: In the case of severe weather such as rain, thunder, lightning or hail, the Show Manager or their appointed representative may call for a delay of the show without consulting other committee members. When the show is resumed, it will continue in the order of go as listed in the program. IF A COMPETITOR HAS LEFT THE SHOW GROUNDS, IT WILL BE CONSIDERED A SCRATCH AND NO REFUND OF ANY KIND WILL BE MADE. If the show cannot be resumed due to unsafe weather conditions, the show committee will determine if the remaining classes can be rescheduled at a later date or if the remaining classes will be cancelled. Competitors will be refunded the class fees for any classes which can not be ridden due to show management's decision to cancel those classes after the start of the event.

TACK AND ATTIRE: The Dancing Horse Dressage Schooling Shows will follow the USEF, USDF, FEI, or WDAA rules as appropriate, with a few exceptions as documented on our website: http://dancinghorsedressage.org/show-rules/. Each competitor is responsible for knowing the rules.

RING PROCEDURES: <u>NUMBERS</u> must be worn at all times while a horse is being ridden, lunged, or hand walked in any arena or designated warmup area. Arena is open on show day for you to walk your horse in-hand around the perimeter of the dressage arena at these two times:

- 1. Immediately after setup until 10 minutes before the first scheduled ride, and
- 2. During the scheduled lunch break until 5 minutes before the first scheduled ride after the lunch break

MUSICAL FREESTYLE: There are NO prerequisites for riding a Freestyle test at any level.

CLASS PLACING AWARDS: First place award and ribbons for first through sixth place. AA, JR/YR classes will have separate placings if there are 3 or more AA and 3 or more JR/YR riders scheduled to ride. If not picked up at the show, unclaimed class ribbons/awards will be returned to the club inventory.

SHOW HIGH SCORE AWARDS: DHD & CT Daily High Scores will be awarded at each show at four levels (Intro, Training, First, Second & Above) for two rider divisions (Open and AA/JR/YR). Musical Freestyle and Dressage Seat Equitation scores do not count for daily high score awards. A score over 55.000% is required for a Daily High Score award. A high score category must have 2 eligible horse/rider combinations for the high score to be awarded. All shows are Jockey Club TIP approved and the overall high score TIP registered horse and rider combination will also be awarded.

For the purpose of High Score Awards, the following equivalencies apply:

CHECK SCORES BEFORE LEAVING SHOW GROUNDS. Corrections gladly made in show office on show day. No corrections will be made after the end of the show.

Note that all USDF Introductory Level tests; WDAA Introductory tests; and USEA tests through Training Level will be ridden in the short arena. All other tests will be ridden in the standard arena.

*Classes marked with an asterisk may be divided with AA and JR/YR pinned separately if at least 3 riders in AA and 3 riders in JR/YR are scheduled to ride on show day. Non-asterisked classes are pinned together.

Classes do not have to and probably will not run in the order listed above.

Test of Choice classes may be entered multiple times for <u>different</u> tests; i.e. TR Level Test 1; TR Level Test 2.

<u>Limitations placed on Horses:</u>

- Horses may enter no more than two consecutive levels, Freestyle levels included.
- Horses showing only at Introductory Level Test B and below may be shown by more than one rider in a class.
- Horses showing only at Introductory Level Test B and below are limited to a maximum of four tests per day.
- Horses showing at Introductory Level Test C through Fourth Level are limited to a maximum of three tests per day.
- Horses are limited to two tests per day above Fourth Level. Horses competing at both Fourth Level and Prix St. Georges, are limited to two tests per day.

Dressage Seat Equitation is NOT considered a test and therefore is not included in the test limit.

Rider divisions:

- Open professional rider of any age
- AA Adult Amateur; non-professional rider over the age of 21 (age as of 12/1/2024)
- JR/YR Junior/Young rider; non-professional rider of age 21 or younger (age as of 12/1/2024)

YEAR-END SERIES AWARDS: DHD & CT Champion and Reserve Champion Series Awards will be given for each class. In addition, an award will be given to the overall high score TIP registered horse/rider combination.

The parameters for this recognition are:

- Rider and owner of horse do <u>NOT</u> have to be members of DHD & CT.
- Volunteer hours must be earned between December 1 of the previous year through May 31 of the competition year.
- Rider must have earned six (6) DHD & CT volunteer hours. Anyone can donate their volunteer hours to a rider for the purpose of year-end series awards but must declare their donation at the time the volunteer service is rendered.
- All 6 volunteer hours must be earned from a DHD & CT run show, clinic, or sponsored event.
- At least three scores over 55.000% in the class, earned at three shows for the same horse/rider combination are required for eligibility.
- In a TOC class entered multiple times by the same horse/rider combination, only the highest score, regardless of test, for the horse/rider combination for each individual show will be considered for the series awards.
- AA, JR/YR classes will have separate Champion and Reserve Champion Series Awards if there are 3 or more AA riders and 3 or more JR/YR riders that are eligible.
- The three highest scores from the show series will be averaged to determine the Champion and Reserve champion for each class.
